99 Deaths In County In 1961

There were 99 deaths in Perquimans County during 1961 and according to 1961 figures from the Public Health Statistics Section of the North Carolina State Board of Health, 61 of the deaths recorded were from heart and blood vessels. Thus 61.5 per cent of total deaths represented by deaths from diseases of the heart and blood vessels.

Other death causes and figures were: Cancer 9, accidents 6, influenza and pneumonia 5, diabetes 1, and other causes 17.
