570.2 Acres Diverted In Grain Program
Farmers began signing up to participate in the 1963 Feed Grain Program on February 4. Even though the payment rate is computed differently from the 1962 rate, most farmers are finding that the benefits from this program are as good or better

than they received under the 1962 program. During the first five days of the sign-up 34 farmers signed to divert 570.2 acres, receiving \$10,438.62 in advance payments. Farmers are urged to get the full details of the program and make their decision at an early date. The closing date of the sign-up is March 22, 1963.
