Minutes Of County Board Of Education

The Perquimans County Board of Education met in special session Monday, March 4, 1963. All members were present.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Representative A. T. Lane met with the Board to discuss certain bills before the General Assembly concerning education in North Carolina.

Superintendent read a punch list of items to be corrected as a result of the inspection held on February 22, 1963, at Perquimans Union School and Perquimans High School. The inspection was made by the architect and his consulting engineers, along with inspector from the Division of School Planning. Motion was made, seconded, and passed to accept the buildings for Perquimans County upon completion of items mentioned in the list and certified by the architect.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed authorizing a power sewing class to begin on March 25, 1963, in Perquimans County.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed to amend item no. 632 of the budget in the amount of \$5500 in order to pay for one car of coal for the county schools, subject to approval by County Commissioners.

Motion was made, seconded,

and passed not to request extension of time for employment of teachers beyond the automatic retirement age of 65 years.

Motion was made, seconded, and passed employing Mrs. Alma Forsman Burke as maid at Perquimans Union School.

After discussion, the function of the Citizens' Committee for Better Schools, the superintendent was instructed to invite the committee to meet with the Board at some date in April, the date to be set later.

All members of the Board visited the Perquimans Union School and Perquimans High School Cafeteria for inspection. The Board adjourned to meet again on April 1, 1963.
