

## Test Acreage Of Sweet Corn Planted

Charles Harrell, Jr., Chairman of the Industrial Committee of the Perquimans County Chamber of Commerce, announced that a test acreage of sweet corn has been planted by Perquimans County farmers for Fox Canning Company of Queen Anne, Md. Harrell stated that members of the Chamber of Commerce had made personal contact with the company on the New York trip the week of February 25th. Members of the delegation attending the North Carolina Day were Joel Hollowell, Jr., W. F. Ainsley, Tommy Byrum and A. L. Aydtlett, Jr.

The test planting is designed to create a new market for farmers in the county. This variety of corn is not limited under the Feed Grain Program under the Federal Government. If this year's test shows that it will be profitable for farmers and a good quality of corn can be grown in this area, equipment will be brought into the county to aid the farmers under next year's program. Special machinery for harvesting the corn will facilitate the farmers getting their crop harvested. A husking-cutting and washing process to be set up next year or the year after is being planned.

"The Chamber of Commerce has been working on this project for sometime now. Fortunately, the New York trip gave us the opportunity to personally contact this company and this greatly helped them decide on the program."
