

Weekly Legislative Summary

Editor's Note: This is one of the most important sessions of the Legislature in the history of the State. The General Assembly has met in session for the first time since the death of Governor Patton. It is expected that a number of important bills will be passed.

As the General Assembly returned early Wednesday from its last road trip of the session, there was considerable sentiment to the effect that the practice of holding out-of-Raleigh sessions had gotten out of hand. SB 476, introduced Friday, requires that sessions be held at the seat of government, except in civil defense emergencies and in time of war, and authorizes the General Assembly to appoint special committees composed of the presiding officers and designated members to represent the General Assembly at special events to which invitations are extended.

Appropriations
The report of the joint Appropriations Subcommittee is being put in final form and will be considered by the full committee next Tuesday. The subcommittee reportedly recommends an increase of some \$27 million over the original Budget bill. This increase just about cancels out an increase of about \$32 million in revenue estimates for the period from now to the end of the 1963-65 biennium. The closeness of the two figures dampens hopes of any substantial tax cut. In the absence of major revision of the revenue laws, the progress of the appropriations bill will be a guide to the length of the session; members do not usually stay around very long after money problems are settled.

Public Utilities
Monday night saw three bills introduced relating to suppliers of electricity in municipalities. SB 439 by Sen. White, provides that a supplier of electricity to an area which is annexed to or incorporated into a municipality must, on application of the municipality or the public utility furnishing electricity to the municipality under franchise, sell its facilities and properties in the annexed area to the town or franchised public utility, and the supplier may require the town or franchised utility to purchase such facilities and properties. If the parties cannot agree upon a fair price and terms, they can be determined under the general law governing eminent domain.

SB 444 by Sen. Long, contains the same general provisions as to annexed territory as appear in SB 439; adds provisions defining the territory of electric membership corporations; provides a means by which an electric membership corporation may organize as a public utility; and sets out a formula by which members of the membership corporation may acquire stock in the utility company. HB 909, by Rep. Drummond, contains provisions somewhat similar to the other two bills with respect to areas annexed to a municipality; and in addition reduces from 60 to 20 years the maximum length of time for which a municipality may grant franchises for utility services (the franchises are renewable), and requires that tax-exempt suppliers of utility services make payments in lieu of taxes to the municipalities in which the services are supplied.

HB 203, the General Statutes Commission's revision of the utility laws, has been sent to a House subcommittee composed of Rep. High, Harris, Johnson, Simpson, Thornburg, Venters and Wicker. Numerous bills dealing with public utilities are still in the Public Utility Committees of the respective houses.

Senate Redistricting
HB 1, the House version of the Currie Bill, was amended Wednesday to change the assignments of Alexander, Craven, and Watauga Counties and then passed second reading by a vote of 80 to 30. Rep. Henley, sponsor of the bill, sent up the amendments to conform with thinking expressed in the Senate committee which is considering the Senate version, SB 6. Third reading of the House bill was postponed until next Wednesday, by which time it is expected that the Senate Committee on Election Laws and Legislative Representation will have acted.

Motor Vehicles
SB 470 provides that the displaying of a motor vehicle for sale at any business raises a prima facie presumption that the owner of the business is a motor vehicle dealer who must be licensed as such. SB 471 defines "established place of business" of auto dealers to mean at least 2 offices or showrooms each of which contains a minimum of 64 square feet of floor space; the present statute provides that if a used car lot is not immediately adjacent to the dealer's established place of business, a supplementary license is required for the lot. SB 472 constitutes the

directors of C & D and Administration and the commander of the Highway Patrol as a continuing committee to determine the type, design, mottoes, colors, etc. of State registration plates. HB 957 requires, as a condition to registration of a motor vehicle, that the owner show proof of financial responsibility for the duration of the registration period. SB 469 (HB 964) sets up a separate retirement system for the Enforcement Division of the Highway Patrol; the Governor is authorized to transfer any part of the General Fund surplus to the Patrol Retirement Fund if necessary to keep the fund on a sound basis.

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE AT NIGHT, UNATTENDED IN THE TOWN OF HERTFORD, N. C.
Whereas, the governing body of the Town of Hertford, N. C., have had numerous complaints, regarding and concerning dogs running-at-large at night, and the damage and disturbance caused by these said dogs; and Whereas, the governing body of the Town of Hertford, N. C., desires to give its Police Department

more authority in order to properly regulate this matter, now, therefore,
Be it ordained by the Commissioners of the Town of Hertford, N. C.:
Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to let, or allow, his, her, or their dog, or dogs, to run loose at night, unattended, on and after the hour of 6 o'clock P. M., until and after 6 o'clock A. M.
Section 2. Any dog found by the police department, or member thereof, running loose unattended, during the hours above set out, may be impounded or destroyed by the said police department, or member thereof.
Section 3. Any person, or persons, violating this ordinance, shall be fined, or sentenced to jail, or both, in the discretion of the Court.
This said ordinance is a supplement, and an addition, to other regulatory ordinances now in effect in the Town of Hertford, N. C., and shall be in full force and effect on and after June 1, 1963.

Notice To Dog Owners

State law requires every dog owner in North Carolina to have his or her animal vaccinated against Rabies. As County Dog Warden and Rabies Inspector, I vaccinated dogs during April and will continue through May 31st.

Very few dogs were brought to the scheduled places during the month of April... for the remainder of the clinic vaccination period, through May 31st, I will be vaccinating dogs on Saturday of each week at Joe & Bill's Service Station in Hertford. You must comply with the law if you have dogs, and have them vaccinated against rabies. The County Dog Warden and Rabies Inspector will make a check on the dogs in the county after May 31st and those owners who have not complied with the law and had their dogs vaccinated, could be cited into court... **SAVE YOURSELF THE ADDITIONAL FEE AFTER THE DEADLINE!**

During the Clinic the vaccination price is \$1.00; after May 31st there will be an additional charge... Please bring your dog to me at one of the indicated locations and save yourself possible court action. The Dog Warden-Rabies Inspector has authority to cite into court anyone not complying with this law.
