**Drought Broken by Timely Rain This Week.** The long drought is broken. Perquimans got its rain this week. Heavy showers fell intermittently all day Monday and Tuesday and on Wednesday there were light showers and misty rain, with quite a drop in temperature.

This is the first rainfall of any consequence since the crops were planted in the early spring, and there has been a great deal of complaint because of the failure of seeds to come up, though the crops throughout the county in general are good with here and there a poor stand of cotton and peanuts. Those farmers who fear wet weather during the growing season like they do the plague, and who claim that there is a great deal of truth in the old saying, "A dry June never begs its bread," are already beginning to watch for the sun to shine out and to show fear that we are in for a wet spell.
