We must never assume that God is confined to these places of self-revelation. Although the thoughts expressed were crude, Jacob prayed. And God calls us to prayer, to communion with him. Thereby we may acquire an expanding understanding of what he is—Spirit of Truth and Holiness. As we reflect on his nature, we also gain new insights into what we would have us be, and our prayers can become purified. Through prayer we can seek purity of heart, holiness of spirit and a dedication to God's holy will for our lives. We can pray for an understanding mind and a clean heart in his service. EXTRACTS FROM MINUTES, BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS A regular meeting of the Mayor and Board of Town Commissioners of the Town of Hertford, N. C., held at the Municipal Building in the Town of Hertford, N. C., at 7:30 o'clock, P. M., on July 8th, 1963.

Present were V. N. Darden, Mayor, and Commissioners W. A. White, John G. Beers and W. F. Ainsley. Absent: Henry C. Sullivan.
