ASCS News

Winter Cover Crops
 Farmers who have not requested assistance for seeding winter cover crops are encouraged to do so now. With the peanut harvest now well under way and with favorable weather, there is still time to sow small grain for winter cover as well as winter and early spring grazing.

The cost-share rate is \$2.00 per acre and the late date for plating small grain is wheat and rye, November 10 and November 1 for oats.

Freeman: On Wheat Program
 According to Secretary Freeman, four out of every five wheat farmers in the main wheat producing areas of the United States favor continuation of some kind of a wheat program. He said that after nine meetings, five of which were in major wheat areas, "I am convinced it is not true that wheat farmers flatly oppose programs to limit wheat production and to support price. In these meetings, I have asked thousands of farmers from New York to the State of Washington whether they favor or oppose continuation of wheat programs. The response has been sharply favorable to continued programs."

He explained, however, that when he asked farmers to describe the kinds of wheat program they would support, the answer was not clear at all.

1964 Feed Grain Program
 An information pamphlet has been mailed to community and county committeemen. Additional details on the program will be made available to feed grain producers before the sign-up period, which is planned for early 1964.

There will also be a meeting for ASCS committeemen to explain the 1964 program some time during the month of November.
