1964 Feed Grain Program

The 1964 feed grain program is very similar to the 1963 program. The program will be voluntary, all feed grain bases are combined, diversion payments are available, and price support will be made available to participating farms.

There are a few basic changes that affect farmers. Farmers may divert the large rof 25 acres or 50% of the feed grain bases. Eure. This compares with a maximum divert the larger of 25 acres or acres or 40% of the base in 1963. The payment rates will be higher this year for farmers diverting above 40% of their total base. The double cropping provision will be eliminated from the 1964 program. Acreage diverted in 1964 may not have a crop harvested under the double
