

Demonstration On Rat Feeding

The Rat Feeding Demonstration started this week at Perquimans Union School, Winfall, under the supervision of Mr. G. N. Reid as chairman. This demonstration is designed to help boys, girls and adults realize the need for milk in their diets. The demonstration is simple, but effective. It is entitled "Milk Makes The Difference." White rats were chosen for this project because they respond to the effect of milk similar to human beings. They are used in separate compartments of wire cages. There are five sets of rats to this demonstration. Half of the rats are on bread and milk diet and the other half

are on bread and soft drink diet. The life span of the rats is very short and the result of milk in the diet can be seen in an average of six to eight weeks. The rats are to remain in the schools for six weeks.

They are located in the following classrooms of the Perquimans Union School: Mrs. T. Ebron, Mr. T. E. Bolden, Miss D. M. Jennings, Mr. H. E. Daughtry, and Mrs. J. S. Thompson. While the rats are in the school, all classes will use them along with their studies. Daily and weekly reports will be kept by the students.

Plans are being made for the rats to travel throughout the county to prove to the people that milk makes the difference. The public is urged to observe the rats while they are in the school.

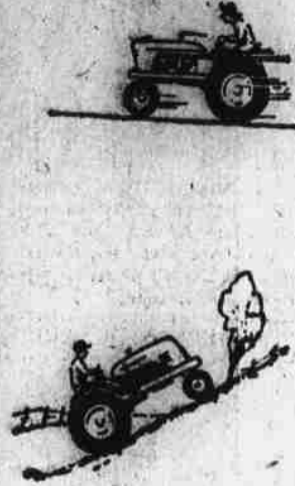

OUR SOIL ★ OUR STRENGTH

The Soil and Water Conservation District Supervisors of Northeastern Area Five held their annual meeting in the Cafeteria of East Carolina College in Greenville, N. C., on November 15. Those attending from Perquimans County were: Mr. and Mrs. George G. Winslow, Mr. and Mrs. John A. Bray, Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Matthews, Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Hollowell, Jr., Mr. and Mrs. F. A. McGoogan, Joseph W. Nowell, Jr., A. T. Lane, R. L. Spivey, George Bellmon and R. M. Thompson.

The principal address was made by Dr. Joe Pou, vice president of Wachovia Bank and Trust Company.

Melvin Eure, Belvin Eure, J. Elmer Wood and adjoining landowners in the Snow Hill community are planning to deepen and enlarge the main outlet ditch which drains their lands. This ditch is approximately 8700 feet in length.

A. W. Jordan, Jr., is constructing an outlet ditch to drain his farm in the Bethel Community.

Mr. Jordan is planning to seed the side slopes of his ditch to fescue grass immediately after construction to help prevent silting in the ditch. Mr. Jordan also plans to seed the turn row in his field next to his ditch to fescue grass to prevent erosion.

ASCS News

With the three goals of making the agricultural price-support programs more effective, less costly and simpler, the U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced changes in operating provisions for grains and similarly handled commodities. The changes will become effective with the 1964 price support programs.

The new procedures should simplify the various programs. Under previous conditions, a considerable interval sometimes elapsed before producers could obtain their farm storage loan funds, due to the required exact measurements of quantity and determination of quality factors.

Under the new procedure, the county ASC office representative and the producer will jointly confirm the existence and apparent condition of the commodity. Together they can develop a quantity estimate to which a reasonable safety factor will be applied.

However, at delivery time CCC will accept all of the eligible commodity and settlement will be based on its grade, quality and quantity. Where a producer wants only price support protection without a loan, no farm visit will be made.

Local farmer ASC committeemen will have more responsibility under the new plan. To lessen the need for detailed administrative instructions, and in the interest of permitting greater promptness in dealing with special crop and weather situations, more opportunity for discretionary actions is to be given State and county ASC committeemen.

General guides will be issued to committeemen. Community com-

mitteemen will handle application and collateral-inspection duties.

A service charge on commodities placed under loan will be continued, but will be credited to a producer's account if he redeems.

Price support may be requested by filing an application and payment of a nominal non-refundable fee. This application also will replace the purchase agreement form. On loans, the producer may draw money in total lump sum, or installment as desired.

Particulars on handling of the various commodity price-support programs will be issued to State and county offices well in advance of local harvest dates.

Opportunities In U. S. Marine Corps

"There is one way for service minded young men and women to remove the doubt of their future occupation," says Marine Recruiter Sgt. Fred Harrell of Hertford, "it is the Marine Corps' method of classification and placement."

Recruit Marines are given a series of tests to match them to their jobs by interests and abilities.

Called the Aptitude-Area Classification Tests, the series replaces the General Classification Tests which measure only the individual's general mental ability.

Tested in such fields as armor, artillery and engineer, infantry, electronics, general maintenance, motor maintenance, clerical, general technical, and radio code, recruit Marines have the opportunity to prove their abilities, known or unknown.

Marine recruits are not assigned a military occupational specialty, but are identified by an aptitude-area until they have been placed in a specific job.
