Local Baptist Church Shows Much Progress: The Rev. D. S. About \$1800 Saved: Fifteen thousand dollars worth of street improvement refunding bonds of the Town of Hertford were sold by the Local Government Commission which met in Raleigh on Tuesday. The bonds, which were purchased by a Raleigh Company, carry a rate of 4 1/2 percent interest and the money received for them will be used to take up bonds which are past due and which bear interest at the rate of 6 percent. The transaction represents a saving to the town of approximately \$1800.

Slot Machines Definitely Out in Perquimans: The slot machine has disappeared from the county.

January 1 Deadline for New Auto Tags: A 1936 automobile license plate mustn't be seen on the highway after January 1st, according to Corporal G. I. Dail of the State Highway Patrol. The 1937 license must be displayed on the first day of the year on every automobile, or the driver will be subject to arrest.

Schools Closed Until January 4 for Holidays: There will be no more school in Perquimans County until January 4. All the schools were closed on Wednesday at noon by order of F. T. Johnson, Superintendent of Education, who announced that this step was necessary because of

62, 65, 72! These numbers might be signals called by a quarterback but they are also important numbers as far as social security benefits are concerned.

At age 62 reduced social security benefits are payable to those persons who retire or limit their earnings and who wish to elect reduced benefits. In general, benefits payable at age 62 are about 20% less than the usual weather conditions and the fact that there was so much difficulty in children from the more distant points of the county reaching the high school in Hertford.

age 65. Since the benefits payable at age 62 are reduced, every worker should contact his social security district office for a full explanation of these benefits before he finally decides to retire at age 62.

At age 65 full benefits are payable to those workers who retire completely or limit their earnings to less than \$1200. It is also a good idea for the man who is going to retire at age 65 to visit his social security office about 3 months before he plans to retire. This will allow us to develop his claim fully without delaying his first check.

And at age 72 a person can receive his social security benefits even if he continues working. Beginning with the month a person becomes 72 years old social security benefits are pay-

able regardless of how much money he earns.

When will you file for social security benefits? Well, that's up to you. However, if you want free, competent, professional advice, ask the representative at your social security office, not your next door neighbor.
