**Sunday School Lesson**  
**ALL NATIONS UNDER GOD**  
 International Sunday School Lesson for May 31  
 Memory Selection: "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people."—Proverbs 14:34.  
 Lesson Text: Isaiah 40:1-11; 20: 31-3; Amos 1 and 2; Acts 17:23-31.  
 In this lesson for today we endeavor to help adults become aware of God's concern for all nations, and to recognize that his judgment is in keeping with his righteousness.  
 In pursuing our studies today we need to discover how the Christian principles which apply to inter-personal relationships should influence one's loyalty to his own country, and his attitude toward other nations. We can find a good basis for this in the attitude reflected in the Books of Isaiah and Amos.  
 In reading Amos 1 and 2, we observe that the crimes of the neighbor nations were, for the most part, crimes against humanity. But the feeling of indignity in reading these passages, that Judah and Israel, simply because they were chosen by God, and had accepted God's covenant, were accountable for an even higher righteousness. In other words, God would deal justly among nations; but they were not to be excused from God's judgment on that account—being God's chosen people. They would receive no favoritism when it came to judgment of their crimes. This situation can be likened to the relationship of a father and his son.  
 When a father has to correct a fault in his son, it ill behoves anyone to question his love for the child. Indeed, a lack of criticism and correction on the part of the parent could very rightly be construed as a lack of interest in the child and his welfare. It is only when we care deeply for our children, and what they will become, that we face the pain it must necessarily inflict upon us as parents when we have to discipline a beloved child.  
 In the same vein, the honor and good of a country depends upon ridding it of evil and corruption then upon teaching of its virtues.  
 America is a great nation. She has a proud heritage. To her the eyes of the Western world turn for guidance. When she speaks through her government—a government elected by her people—whether it be on internal affairs or external—world trade or nuclear weapons, the whole world listens—and assesses. How she stands in the eyes of her neighbors depends largely on the quality and dedication of her leaders. The qualities they possess are of sterling worth—bravery, ability, foresight, courage, compassion—and a firm belief in Christianity.  
 They must always be cognizant of the fact that God treated all nations—that what affects one, affects all. What a heavy burden they bear on their shoulders; especially in the day and time when ships and airplanes have served to make the world so small and tightly-knit.  
 We, as Americans, can be rightly proud of our country's place in history, and in world affairs. But we must ever be mindful of the fact that in order for a man to have a great love for his country it is not necessary for him to hate all other countries.  
 True nationalism and true Christianity are not opposites. "He made from one every nation of men to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their habitation." (Acts 17:26). The truth of this statement can best be adjudged by a study of history. Many nations have climbed to great heights, and whether they have stayed there, or for how long, has been determined by their conduct, both towards themselves and towards others.  
 It is not too hard to see that when they have consistently fallen from grace their downfall has been inevitable. It is all part of God's plan in this universe of His. It therefore does not take too analytical a mind to realize that the downfall of many countries has come about when those countries turned against the moral laws of the Creator.  
 And while a far cry to
