Perquimans County now has re farm storage in proportion to its total cropland than any county in North Carolina Well over 500,000 bushel capacity has been erected on county farms within the past five years Although this 1/2 million bushel is an excellent start in a

county with less than 50,000 acres of cropland, there is still need for more grain storage and peanut drying facilities.

It is estimated that 85% of the

peanuts harvested in the county in 1963 were dried artificially. This more modern method of harvesting has proven most satisfactory with the ideal weather during the harvesting season the past three years. However, a wet fall could mean trouble for some farmers who depend on this method of harvesting unless more drying bins are available.
