There were 26,482 voting for the continuation of the assessment in the recent referendum and 520 who voted against the continuation. According to Mr. Beach, these preliminary figures indicate a upport of 98.1% in favor. Joe S. Sugg, executive secretary of North Carolina Peanut Growers Association, said that his was a clear vote of confilence on the part of the growers for the board of directors and the administrative officer: of the association, who have been responsible for administerng the funds collected under this program in the promotion of production, marketing and sumption of peanuts. Mr. Sugg was very high in praise of the community, county and state workers who actively participated in getting out this, the largest vote in the history of the Peanut Growers Association which began in 1953, this vote being 9.000 more than the largest received in the past refer-
