Hertford Jaycees Push **Driver Education Plans** With Other Local Groups

The Hertford Jaycees are engaged in an effort among local civic and church groups in behalf of the statewide attempt to make driver education in the high school available for all new drivers under 18.

The General Assembly will be asked to appropriate an additional two million dollars to enable the public schools to provide a standard high school driver education course for every prospective driver reach-Jing 16 years of age.

The standard course consists of a minimum of 30 hours classroom instruction and six hours practice driving instruction, both under a certified teacher. The 8-hour safety education course now being conducted by the Department of Motor Vehicles for persons unable to enroll in high school courses does not include practice driving instruction and would be discontinued under the proposed expansion of the high school program.

Local Jaycees will have the job of informing community groups on the role of driver education in accident prevention, according to local president Sid Harmon.
