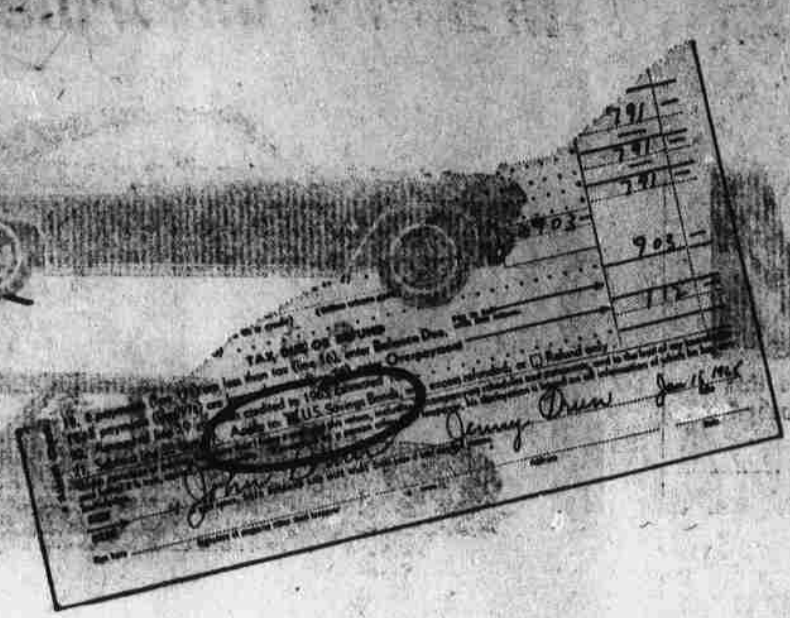

STAR-SPANGLED SAVINGS PLAN FOR ALL AMERICANS

The best method is to band the fertilizer in one or two bands at least three inches to the side and three inches below the seed of young plants. This allows the roots to grow down into the soil without growing directly into the fertilizer band and still puts the fertilizer close enough to be readily available to the young plants.

Fertilizer applied before planting can be broadcast and mixed with the soil or banded so long as the seeds or young plants are not placed in contact with the fertilizer band or directly over a shallow band. Don't let the possibility of fertilizer damage prevent your

using enough fertilizer. Be careful how you apply it, especially at the beginning of the season. The right amount and kind of fertilizer, properly placed, is still one of the best investments a farmer can make.
