

## KNOW YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY

Donald Morris, representative of the Social Security Administration, is in Hertford the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month at Perquimans County Courthouse.

Nine out of ten working people are now building protection for themselves and their families under the social security law. This protection costs employees and their employers a total social security tax of 7 1/4 per cent of every dollar earned and each self-employed person 5.4 per cent of his net profit up to the taxable limit of \$4800.

It should be logical to assume, then, that nearly everyone knows what they and their families might be due from their Federal Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance Program at retirement or in case of disability or death. Unfortunately, this isn't so. As the following information on parents' benefits is explained, be truthful and score yourself 10 points for each fact you know.

After the death of a worker, social security benefits may be paid to a dependent parent at age 62, but an application must be filed before benefits can start. Proof that the deceased son or daughter furnished at least one-half the support of the parent must be presented to the Social Security Administration within two years after the worker died or be-

came disabled. The parent must not have remarried since the supporting son's or daughter's death or be entitled to a retirement benefit on his own work that is equal to or larger than the parent's benefit. A monthly benefit is equal to 82 1/2 per cent of the deceased worker's basic benefit and ranges from a minimum of \$40 to a maximum of \$104.80 per month. Where two parents or a parent and a widow are both entitled to benefits on the same record of work, each will receive 75 per cent of the basic benefit, providing the total benefits do not exceed the maximum family payment.

Now, how did you do? If you scored 100 or better, you are really up on your social security. But if a lot of this was news to you, then maybe you should read booklet OASI-35, entitled "Your Social Security."
