persons who would like to attend Open House with the Perquimans County group should contact the County Agents' office.

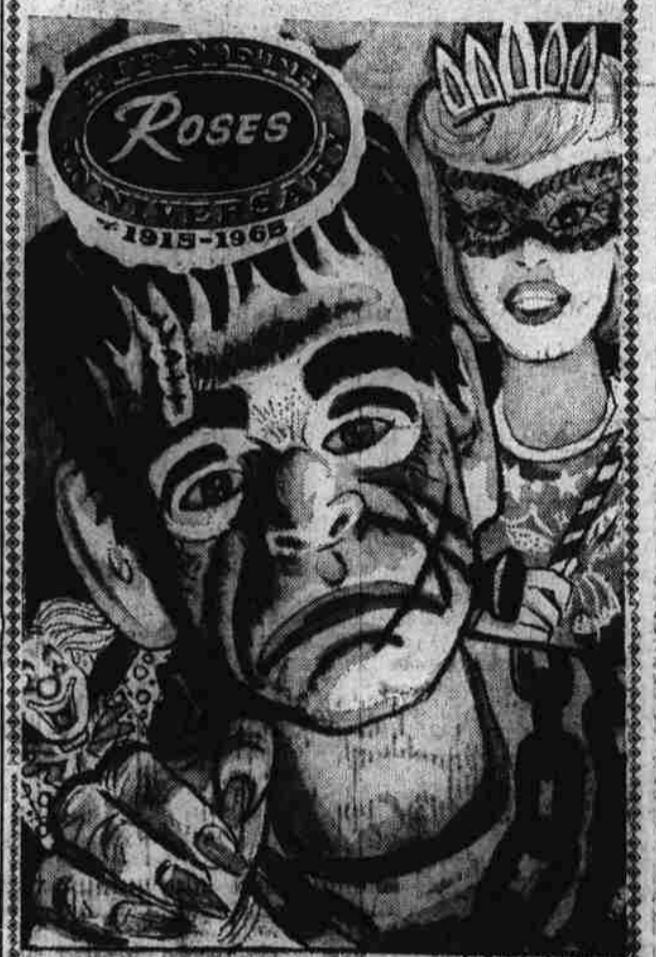
BRIDGE CLUB MEETS
