## Wool Program Years Ends December 31, 1965

The 1965 wool marketing year ends December 31, 1965. All applications for incentive payments on shorn wool or unshorn lambs must be filed by January 31, 1966. All persons that have marketed shorn wool or unshorn lambs that have not filed an application should visit this office before the deadline.

Wool is one of the few commodities of which we have a deficient supply and the wool incentive payment is paid to encourage the production of wool in this country.

**Loans On Corn And/Or Soybeans Available**  
Loans are available on 1965 crop corn and soybeans stored in acceptable facilities.

**Loan Rate**  
Corn—\$1.22 per bushel.  
Soybeans—\$2.25 per bushel.  
Interest Rate—30¢ per month per each whole unit of \$100.00.

Through December 15, 1965, this office had disbursed 15 price support loans totaling \$74,744.52 on 81,266 bushels of corn. Loans to five soybean producers totaling \$22,074.75 on 9,811 bushels of soybeans have also been disbursed.

We encourage all farmers to take advantage of our price support loan programs when they need ready cash and desire to hold commodities for the most favorable

**Peanut Yields**  
Approximately 70% of the peanut marketing cards have been returned. Producers returning cards have produced 6,357,364 pounds of peanuts on 2,458.1 acres. The average yield is a record 2,588 pounds per acre.

All persons that have not returned their peanut marketing cards are requested to do so at once.

and pretty, give it the water treatment. Cut off the end of the trunk diagonally at least one inch above the original cut. Stand the tree at once in a container of water and keep it there all the time you have it in the house. Be sure the water level is above the cut surface. This will keep the needles from drying out and becoming flammable.

As an added safeguard against fire you may wish to spray the tree with fire retardant coating. This recipe from the United States Forest Products Laboratory will make the needles shiny and translucent.

Mix together nine parts water glass (sodium silicate, available at some drug stores) and one part water to which a teaspoon of detergent has been added. Spray or paint on your tree for added beauty and safety.

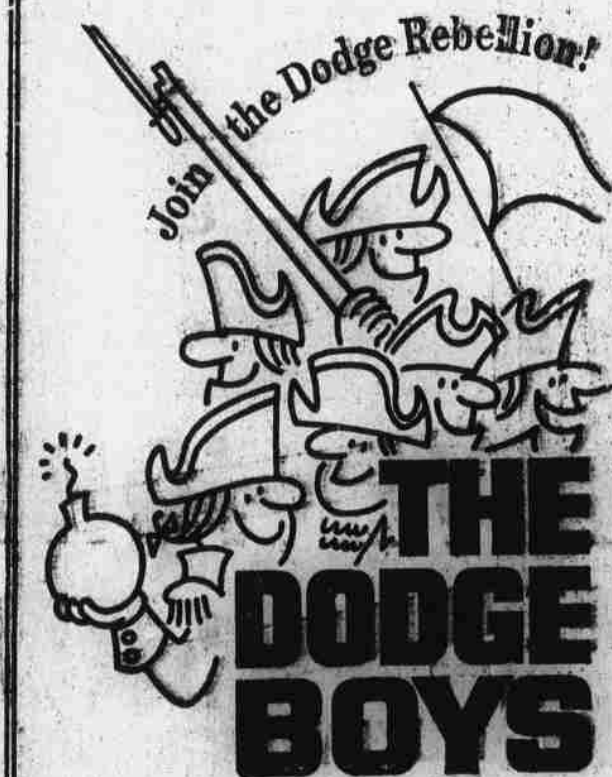
