National average price support loan levels under the 1968 program will be at the 1967 level; for corn, \$1.05 per bushel; sorghum, \$1.61 per hundredweight. Price support payments will continue at 30 cents per bushel for corn and 53 cents per hundredweight for sorghum, based on planted acreage up to one-half of the farm base times projected yield.

Other key provisions of the 1968 teed grain program are:

1. Required acreage diversion to conserving use to qualify

for this minimum diversion, excospt excospt to small farm acreages—the same as in 1966 and 1967.

2. Additional acreage diversion will be possible up to a total of 50 per cent at the base of 25 acres, whichever is larger, the same as in 1966. The acreage diversion payment rate will be at 45 per cent of the total price support times the projected yield.

3. Exceptions were made for small farm diversion payments, both in 1967 and 1968, and the similar exception will be continued in 1968. A farm with a base of 25 acres or less will get
