Anti-Smog War Is Comfortable
ST. LOUIS — Another front has been opened in the auto industry's war against air pollution and the battlefield is quite comfortable. This anti-smog battle is being fought in an unusual new building put up by ACF Industries here for the precise testing and adjustment of carburetors so they will meet the strict requirements of the Federal Clean Air Act. Barometric pressure, temperature and humidity must be closely controlled so that the carburetors will give the necessary uniform performance. The building, therefore, had to be designed to withstand differences in inside and outside air pressure, and employees and materials must enter and exist through air locks to maintain the stable and pleasant-climatic conditions.

NEW YORK — No longer is the building CBS Studio 50. It is now the Ed Sullivan Theater. The network made the change to commemorate the 20th anniversary of Sullivan's variety show which long has used this theater. A—Yes, The fact that you would be receiving disability compensation from the VA does not change your entitlement to military hospitalization as a retired serviceman. At the same time, you are also entitled to VA hospital care as a veteran.
Q—My deceased husband's headstone furnished by the Army has become unsightly because of age. Will the Army furnish me another marker for his grave?
A—Each request is decided on its own merits. You should apply for a replacement marker to Chief Support Service, Department of the Army, Wash., D. C. 20315. In your application be sure to give full details in concerning the appearance and disrepair of the present headstone.

Q—I expect to graduate from college next spring and go into Throughout college I have received a monthly check from the Veterans Administration under the War Orphans Assistance Act. When I completed my military service will I again be eligible for VA educational assistance as a veteran?
A—Not under existing law. If you were a full time student in college and received a War Orphans Educational Assistance Allowance for 36 months, you will not be entitled to further educational benefits as a veteran. The maximum entitlement of any person to Federal assistance for full time education is 36 months. Any additional education for which the person would receive an allowance from the U.S. Government would constitute "duplication of benefits," which is prohibited.

FRANKFURT, Germany — American GIs stationed in Europe have been warned that their pen pals behind the Iron Curtain may be espionage agents.
According to top Army and Air Force officials in Germany, pen pals — one of the serviceman's greatest morale boosters — actually pose a serious threat to military security.
Using such gimmicks as lonely hearts clubs, stamp and coin clubs and pen pals, Eastern European espionage agencies attempt to gain the confidence of soldiers and airmen as sources of information concerning American troop and equipment deployment.
Since contact is maintained by mail, military intelligence officials admit they have little control over pen pals and other unsolicited correspondents.
U.S. postal regulations prohibit the opening of first class mail under any circumstances, and unclaimed second and third class mail may be opened only after the serviceman leaves Europe.
The only source left is the soldier or airman who, under his own initiative, reports suspicious correspondence to his unit intelligence officers.
The majority of complaints deal with the volume of junk advertising and occasionally with pornography.
Lack of complaints about subversive correspondence indicates the unawareness by servicemen of the threat posed by such mail, officials say.
A soldier usually receives a letter saying he was mentioned by a friend as being interested

Organizations operating by mail are difficult to investigate, especially if they are located in Communist countries.
Since there is no such thing as an innocent pen pal in the Communist sectors, according to officials, pen pal correspondence is discouraged.
Servicemen also are being harassed by mail sent by sub-

versive organizations in the United States. Such mass produced mail is designed to damage morale, confuse and create dissension among U.S. servicemen.
Subversive mail originating in the United States is investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
Military officials said the recent Supreme Court decision throwing out the convictions of three distributors of pornography is expected to result in increased pornographic mail aimed at servicemen in Europe.
However, distributors now are requesting the serviceman to return the correspondence if he is not interested.

It will have a tongue-in-cheek approach to espionage and international intrigue.
On March 14 "NBC Children's Theater" will present a one-hour adaptation of "The Enormous Egg." Oliver Butterworth's book about a New England boy whose pet hen hatches an enormous egg from which emerges a triceratops dinosaur.
Elizabeth Taylor does much of the narration, both on and off camera, for a one-hour special about the career of her late husband that is entitled "Around the World with Mike Todd." ABC has acquired first air rights to the independently produced program but has set no broadcasting date.
