This is the season to put away wools not used during the summer and to clean or wash those left out for use, Clean damaged by moths and carpet

In moth infested homes it is wise to keep wools in tightly closed plastic bags or take them to a cleaner who uses a moth-proofing solutions all year -others do it only in spring and early summer.

If the cleaner gives no moth-

proofing guarantee, it is wise to give garments the arra security of a mothproof chest,

security of a mothproof chest, closet, or container.

Would you know a moth if you saw one? And how about that more destructive enemy, the carpet beetle? A recently revised USDA bulletin helps you recognize these enemies and keep them under control.

  2 t. chopped passley

Cook potatoes, onion, garlio, bay leaf, and rosemary, in enough water to cover potatoes, until tender (20 to 40 minutes). Remove garlic and bay leaf. Drain, mash, add butter or margarine, bot milk and mace. Beat until creamy. Garnish with nameler.

14 cup orange juice 2 teaspoons maple syrup blended


Blend all ingredients together. Serve over apple, orange, pineapple and peach fruit salads.


