WHAT FAITH REQUIRES

International Sunday School Lesson for October 20, 1968
MEMORY SELECTION: "Wherefore seeing we also are encompassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin of which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God."
 —(Hebrews 12:1-2)

LESSON TEXT: Hebrews 12-13.

The passages we are studying today can become the very foundation of our lives, if we will but apply ourselves diligently to understanding the messages they contain.
 In these verses, Christ is presented as High Priest . . . a man of unflinching faith. And if any doubt on this score exists, we have only to recall that — for His faith, and our salvation — He (as our Memory Selection verses (Hebrews 12:1-2) so beautifully put it, endured the shame of the cross, the pain of the cross, because . . . above and beyond that fearful shadow, He saw the glory He, above all, knew "the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." He lived a life worthy of His faith, and — to truly emulate Him — we must commit our lives without reservation to Jesus Christ.
 Men and women from all walks of life have had faith. (If we are in any doubt on this score, we have but to study the Book.) And faith — like forgiveness — does not belong to any one class, or any one person. It . . . unlike riches, and the things which are a by-product of riches . . . can belong to rich and poor, the high-born and the low, the educated and the lesser-educated!
 Our faith can be the very backbone of our existence; it can inspire us in times of achievement; it can comfort us in our times of sorrow; it can strengthen us in our times of weakness. There are no ends to what faith can accomplish in our lives if we will but let God take over!
 The writer of Hebrews had something to say . . . and he said it beautifully! The encouragements that impede our progress must be laid aside, that we may be free of foot, sounder of lungs, and discover in ourselves the qualities of patience and endurance!
 And who among us do not have encumbrances? True, they may vary, as our very personalities vary, but we need to be quick to recognize (each and every one of us) our particular besetting sin! With some it is pride, egotism with others it is indifference towards our fellow man, and towards God; with still others it is self-righteousness, or ambition . . . oh, the "weights" to lay aside are indeed endless!
 Old habits, old sins, are not set aside. To do so takes perseverance and dedication. As Christians, we must humbly accept the demands of faith . . . the tragedy, the pain, the temptations that are our burdens.
 Endurance and patience — these are Godlike responses. These are the qualities as personified in the character of Christ, Jesus, here, sure, and His attributes, must (of necessity) be the goal in the race we run!
 And we must always remember, should we falter, Christ will not condemn us for that faltering for He has run the same race Himself. He knows the obstacles, the pitfalls. He will look on us with understanding eyes as we check, momentarily, at a seemingly insurmountable barrier!
 Christ was God's only begotten Son — beloved of the Lord, guided, disciplined . . . as are all children, born of parents who dearly love them, and are actively aware of the responsibilities of parenthood. And we are God's children, too, subject to the same teaching, the same guidance, the same discipline. And we must always act as such, respond as such. Only by so doing can we exempt ourselves (at all)!
