Homemaking Hints

How can you remove water spots from fine furniture? Use Grey White, Home Economics Extension Agent says to run the spot with fine steel wool (000 grade) dipped in a small amount of boiled linseed oil. With a little "elbow grease" the water marks will disappear. If available, ground pumice stone can be used instead of fine steel wool for quicker results. The boiled linseed oil and steel wool can be obtained from a hardware store. "The process does not harm the finest furniture but is also a means of cleaning it", further states Mrs. White.
