(Continued from Page 1) sponsibility for administering the programs is vested in the county board of public welfare and the county department of public welfare. The local board may have three or five members, depend-ing upon the wishes of the county commissioners. If the welfare board has three members, one is appointed by the State Board of Public Welfare and one by the board of county commissioners, and the two members select the third member. In case of five members, two are appointed by the State Board and two by the county commissioners, and these four select the fifth member. They are appointed for threevear terms.

This county has three members who presently are Mrs. Walter G. Edwards, Mr. Joel Hollowell, Sr., and Mr. Savage Jolliss, The local welfare board has limited responsibility for the administration of the program. It has the authority to hire the county welfare director, give administrative advice to him, approve and review public assistance cases, participate in community study and planning, develop the local budget and interpret the program to the county commissioners and the public.

Employes of the local welfare department come under the State merit system. They are required to take the competitive examination. The States sets a standard pay scale for the various categories of employes, but counties may elect to pay below the standard scale. Perquimans County pays below the standard. The counties throughout the State are required by State law to pay their proportionate cost of the budget. By the use of an

equilization formula which measures the wealth of the counties,

the range of county participa-tion is from approximately eight

to twenty-five per cent. The total expenditure for Perquimans County this past fiscal year was \$334,932.92. The Federal government paid \$235,697.83 or 70,37 per cent, the State \$59,-250,92 or 17.79 per cent and the county's share was \$39,984,17 or 11.94 per cent.


