RALEIGH - The North Carolina Department of Water and Air Resources has received a contract from the U.S. Department of Labor for a 44-week training course for 80 wastewater treatment plant operators.

The course will consist of classroom work conducted at selected technical institutes and municipal wastewater treatment plants, and on-the-job training conducted by an instructor who will work with each trainee at the plant where he is employed. The total program embraces approximately 330 hours of classroom instruction and 1,430 hours of on-the-job traiing.

Experienced professional nurses will find a wide variety of career opportunities open to them depending on their particu-lar specialization. Opportunities are available in specializations such as operating room, occupational health, psychiatric, clini-cal, administration, research, anesthetist, and many others. Well-qualified candidates will be considered for appointment without regard to race, creed, color, sex, national origin, politics, or any other nonmerit factor, For many of these positions the Federal Government will pay moving expenses to the first post of duty.

Entry levels depend on education and experience, Positions at all grades require graduation from an accredited school of professional nursing, and current-State registration, Graduates of 2-year associate degree programs are qualified to enter at G8-4, graduates of 3-year prorams at GS-5, A year of professional experience at GS-5 cenerally qualifies for the nor mal full performance level of GS-7. Starting salaries at the first full performance level range from 634 to \$722 a month, Pay rates for all professional nurse positions, which vary by locality to keep them competitive with non-Federal rates, are specified in a supplement which accompanies the announcement.

Announcement No. 419 may be obtained from Federal job information centers in major metropolitan areas, from many post offices in cities without job information centers, or from the Interagency Board of U.S. Civil Service Examiners for Washington, D. C., 1900 E. St., N. W. Washington, D. C. 20415, Interested applicants desiring further information about Federal employment, such as fringe benefits, age, citizenship, and veteran preference, are ad-vised also to request a copy of U. S.
