Taking A Breather

Some of the current trends in the treatment of tuberculosis have not exactly caught the fancy of the new medical director of McCain Sanatorium, Dr. Wilbur Steininger joined the North Carolina Sanatorium System staff last June, and he is quick to admi that one of the reasons he wanted to come to the Tar Heel State was the approach that we have toward the treatment of TB.

Dr. Steininger, a victim of tuberculosis himself in the 1940's, pulls no punches about his stand on treating TB patients on an out-patient basis or it general hospitals at this time. "There are trends in other states toward the treatment of TB which would allow people with a positive sputum, that is active TB, to go back into the comminity and come to a clinic once or twice a week for treatment," he said, "That I just can't gc along with. I don't believe that anyone should be allowed to circulate in a home and neighborhood situation when they could be spreading tuberculosis,"

Dr. Steininger explains that he is opposed to discharging patients from the sanatorium until they have been shown to have three negative sputum tests. This will assure the individual and his family that when he returns home he will not be carrying tuberculosis to other people.

His thinking fits into the pattern followed in North Carolina, Our sanatoriums have a policy of not discharging tuberculosis patients until the medical staff is convinced that the patient is no longer an active case.

As for the treatment of tuberculosis in general hospitals, Dr. W. H. Gentry, Medical Director of the State Sanatoriums System, has made himself understood on that question in the past, He says that the general hospitals are not equipped to handle the hundreds of tuberculosis cases reported in this state each year, most of whom require three to four months of hospitalization. Nearly every general hospital in North Carolina is in need of more space and additional staff. What would happen if they had to suddenly make room for the hundreds of patients that are now being treated for tuberculosis in the sanatoriums? According to Doctors

Steininger and Gentry, the treatment of tuberculosis on an outpatient basis is fine, if the patient's disease has first been reduced to a negative state. Otherwise, they both warn, there may be a danger of new and more serious epidemics of tuberculosis in the future.

ECU to Offer Education Course In Elizabeth City


