**Commissioners Proceedings**

**Nov. 3, 1969**

At a regular meeting of the  
Board of County Commissioners  
of the County of Perquimans,  
North Carolina, held on the First  
Monday in November, November  
3, 1969, at 10 o'clock a.m., at  
its regular meeting place in the  
Courthouse, in Hertford, Per-  
quimans County, North Carolina.

Present R. L. Spivey, chair-  
man presiding with commis-  
sioners, Riley S. Monds, Jr., Thomas  
D. Nixon, Lester H. Simpson, and  
Ellis Winslow.

All commissioners were  
present.  
Report was received from De-  
partment of Social Services.

On motion duly made, seconded  
and passed, the Board approved  
the petition requesting N. C. State  
Highway Commission to improve  
and hard surface S. R. No. 1222,  
approximately 1.4 miles in Park-  
ville Township.

On motion duly made, seconded  
and passed, the Board authorized  
the Fire Department budget to be  
amended and increased in the  
amount of \$1,220.00, and the funds  
to be funded from the county  
general fund.

On motion duly made by com-  
missioner Riley S. Monds, Jr.,  
and seconded by commissioner  
Lester H. Simpson, and unani-  
mously passed, the Health De-  
partment Budget approved in  
July, 1969, was authorized to be  
amended by the Board of County  
Commissioners and increased in  
the amount of \$679.27, and the  
funds are to be funded from the  
county general fund.

On motion duly made, seconded  
and passed, the Board approved  
County Health Department's  
participation in USDA's suppli-  
mental food program, when re-  
cipients qualify and are certi-  
fied by the Health Department.  
The Treasurer was ordered  
to pay the following bills:

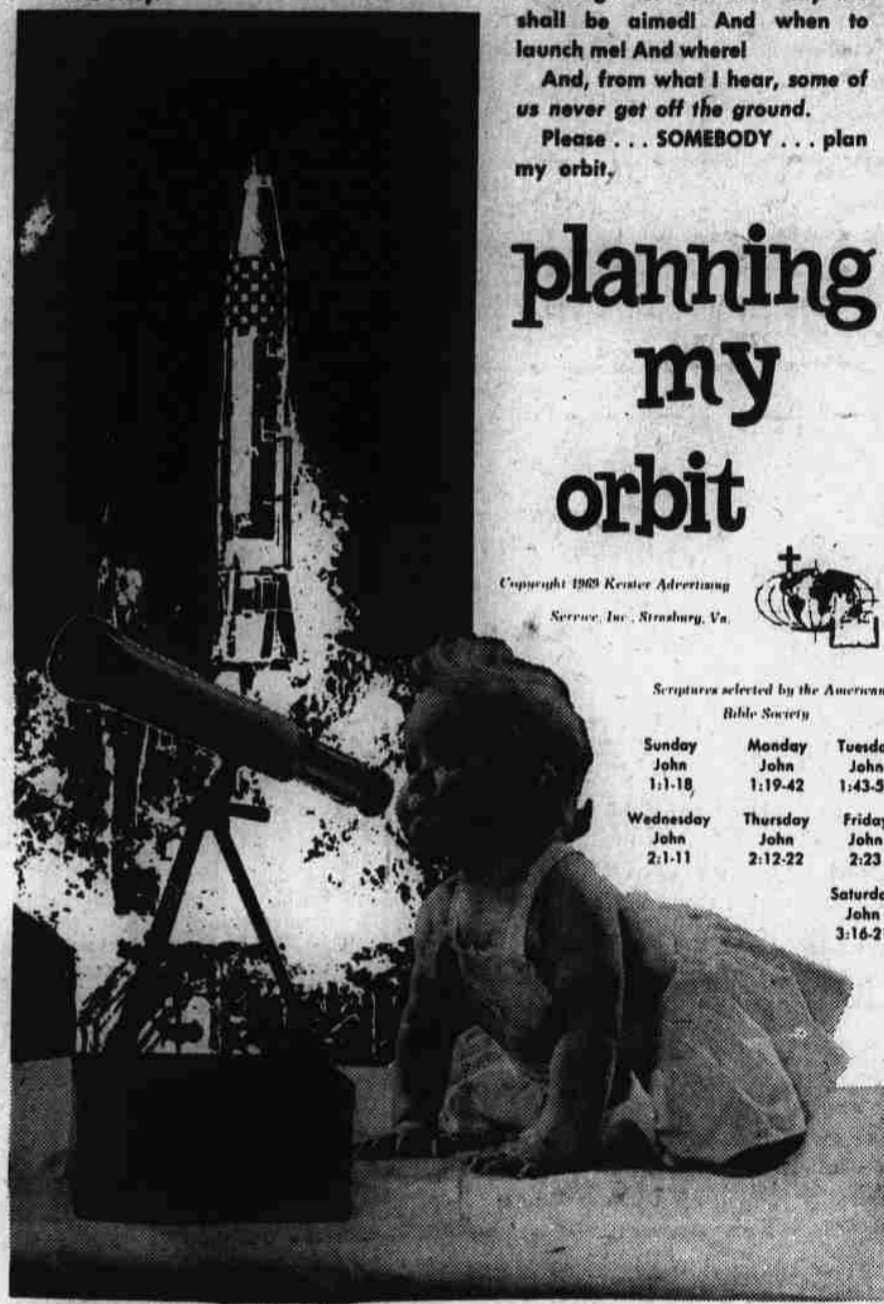
