

### Gov. Designates Sunday, Nov. 23 Traffic Safety Day

Governor Bob Scott has designated Sunday, November 23, "Traffic Safety Sunday in the Churches of North Carolina" and asked all the state's clergymen to devote one day of worship "to the instruction of their congregations in the relationship between religious responsibility and obedience to traffic laws."

While the rising toll of deaths and injuries on the streets and highways of the state should concern all North Carolinians, it should especially concern the religious leaders who, by the very nature of their responsibilities, deal almost daily with the tragic aftermath of highway collisions.

### Veteran's Administration

The Veterans Administration sends a reminder today to veterans and widows who receive pensions, and to parents receiving compensation, to be sure to fill out and return the income questionnaire enclosed with checks dated November 1.

W. R. Phillips, Manager of the Winston-Salem VA Regional Office, said that VA benefits are paid to war veterans with limited income who are totally disabled for reasons not related to military service and to their widows, and to certain other dependents of veterans who meet income limitations.

Where benefits are based on income, the VA, by law, cannot make payments unless it receives the questionnaire containing the estimated income for next year.

The Office in promoting the observance, the Department of Motor Vehicles has compiled religious reference material, suggested sermons, statistics and other traffic safety promotion information for distribution to clergymen participating in the project.

According to Motor Vehicles Commissioner Joe Garrett, the Traffic Safety Sunday observance was initiated in 1968 and proved "highly successful from a participation standpoint." He said more than 500 clergymen contacted his department for material.

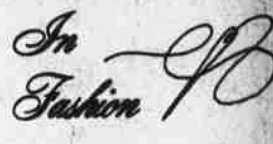
