What is frost? Can it occur when the temperature is above thirty-two degrees?

Frost is nothing but frozen dew, and naturally, dew will not freeze until the freezing point is reached—thirty-two degrees. So it has to be freezing to produce frost.

What confuses most people on this point is the fact that the temperature has to touch thirty-two degrees only briefly to freeze the minute water particles on blades of grass, etc. The frost might last an hour or two—and be visible in shady areas long after the temperature reading is above freezing—but you can be sure it dropped to at least thirty-two when you see frost.
