

**NORTH CAROLINA PERQUIMANS COUNTY**

Under and by virtue of the power of sale contained in a certain deed of trust executed by Coastal Veneer Company, Inc., dated 19th day of June, 1969, and recorded in M. D. Book 48, page 379, in the office of the Register of Deeds of Perquimans County, North Carolina, default having been made in the payment of the indebtedness thereby secured and said deed of trust being by the terms thereof subject to foreclosure, the undersigned trustee will offer for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash at the courthouse door in Hertford, Perquimans County, North Carolina at 11:30 a.m., on the 20th day of March, 1970, the property conveyed in said deed of trust the same lying and being in the Town of Hertford, Hertford Township, Perquimans County, North Carolina, and more particularly described as follows, viz.:  
**FIRST TRACT:** Beginning at a stone marker in the north margin of Grubb Street in the town of Hertford, at a point 564.3 feet, measured westwardly along the north margin of said street from the center of Covent Garden Street; and running thence N. 83 degrees 45 minutes W. with margin of said Grubb Street, 230 feet to a stone marker on the east side of the main entrance to the old Southern Cotton Oil Mill; thence three calls as follows: N 6 degrees 15 minutes E. 78 feet. N. 14 degrees 40 minutes W. 37.4 feet, N. 10 degrees 25 minutes E. 306.5 feet to a stone marker on the southwest side of the Perquimans River; thence southeastwardly along the side of said river the various courses of the said river to a point 14 feet measured northwardly from a stone marker; thence southwardly 14 feet to said stone marker; thence S. 7 degrees 15 minutes W. 390 feet to the beginning, according to

**SECOND TRACT:** Beginning at a stone marker in the north margin of Grubb Street and on the west side of the main entrance to the old Southern Cotton Oil Mill, said stone marker being 246 feet, measured westwardly along the north margin of said street from the beginning point of the above described first tract; and running thence N. 83 degrees 45 minutes W. with the margin of said Grubb Street 202 feet to a stone marker; thence northwardly 157.8 feet to a stone marker at a point 40 feet measured southwardly from the old Southern Cotton Oil Company brick mill building; thence eastwardly a line parallel to said brick building 189 feet to a stone marker at a point 16 feet measured westwardly from the west boundary of the above described first tract; thence southwardly paralleling the west boundary of the above described first tract to the beginning. "First Tract", (which point is 814.3 feet measured westwardly along the north margin of said Grubb Street from the center of Covent Garden Street),

thence along the right of way of said Grubb Street north 83 degrees 45 minutes west 16 feet to the southeast corner of the Hertford Veneers, Inc. "Second Tract"; thence along and with the line of said Hertford Veneers, Inc. "Second Tract" the following calls: north 6 degrees 15 minutes east 75 feet; thence north 14 degrees 40 minutes west 38.1 feet; thence north 10 degrees 25 minutes east 34.1 feet; thence north 78 degrees 35 minutes west 189 feet to an iron pipe situated at the northwest corner of said Hertford Veneers, Inc.
