### Housing Situation Has Improvement In Last 10 Years

The housing situation shows many improvements in the last ten years. A tremendous number of homes have been built and remodeled.

Still, housing conditions are poor. There are many dilapidated and sub-standard homes. When a new home is built families leave sub-standard homes for someone else to occupy or they are left vacant. Low income families make up the majority of families who live in sub-standard houses. A house must be sound and have indoor plumbing fixtures to be a standard house.

According to the 1960 Census, 48% of all housing units in the county did not have inside toilets. 33% of all units did not have piped water. 41% of all units are not sound. 8.6% of all units

did have a central heating system. 33.4% of families had wood heating fuel. 19.8% of all homes were dilapidated. 22% of the houses were deteriorating.

Since 1960 statistics have changed. To get a picture of the housing situation today, one can look around the many dilapidated buildings and poor housing which is a direct contrast to the many new and beautiful buildings in Perquimans County.

In the next ten years, with the resources available today, every family can have an opportunity to live in an adequate home.

### Social Security "Tells It Like It Is"

Young people have a saying, "tell it like it is". Well, here it is from social security. Do two things if you become disabled to work. See your doctor, and make your next stop the Social Security Office.

Folks do the first, but sometimes forget the second, and as a result risk losing social security benefits. There is a 6 month waiting period before any social security checks can be paid, but you should file a claim as soon as you get disabled. This gives ample time to get medical evidence, and answer any questions that might arise.

You can help, by bringing your social security card, your last years W-2 form or tax return and your children's birth certificates with you.

### Recipe of the Week

#### EGGPLANT CASSEROLE

1 eggplant  
1 can shrimp or use fresh shrimp  
2 medium sized tomatoes  
2 T. butter  
1 c. bread crumbs  
1 small onion  
1/2 c. chopped celery  
Worcestershire sauce  
Salt and pepper  
3 eggs  
Crushed potato chips

Boil eggplant until done; drain. Chop fine all other ingredients, season with salt, pepper and Worcestershire sauce to taste. Mix in beaten eggs, add eggplant which has

been mashed. Bake in a greased casserole in an oven 400 degrees for 20 minutes. Sprinkle crushed potato chips over the top and brown.

#### CORN OMELET

1/2 c. fresh or canned corn  
1 egg  
1/4 t. salt-pepper  
2 T. cream  
2 T. butter

Add well beaten egg yolk to chopped corn. Add salt, pepper, and cream. Fold in stiffly beaten egg white. Heat omelet pan, and add butter. Pour in corn mixture and cook until set and well browned. Serve at once.
