Dr. James Edmund Reeves gave his daughter in marriage. Chaplain A. John Wilson officiated.

The renowned, magnificent organ was played by Dr. William Davis, a member of the West Point staff.

The altar flowers were yellow and bronze mums with accents of ivory roses which blended exquisitely with the "old world" charm of this outstanding chapel containing the 82 battle flags used in the Revolutionary War and the Civil War.

Groomsmen Lt. David Michael Carr, Lt. Robert Wagner, Cadet David Hardin and Cadet Charles Swannack in their military uniforms honored the bride and groom with the traditional arch of sabres. William Raymond Decker served his brother as best man.

Miss Mary Boehm, who served as Jane's maid of honor wore a dress identical to those of the bridesmaids. Her headpiece was a Juliet cap made of topaz velvet trimmed in ivory braid. The four attendants of the bride carried full, loosely gathered bouquets fashioned of yellow and bronze mums, ivory rosebuds and baby's breath.

The beautiful bride was a picture in her dress of ivory delustered satin, designed with empire bodice and yoke of Alencon lace rising to the high Victorian collar.
