Middle School Workshop Planned For Burlington

Woodlawn Middle School in Alamance County will be on view next week when almost 300 Tar Heel Educators will visit the area for a unique educational workshop. Theme of the March 16-18 meeting, according to Assistant State Superintendent Jerome Melton, is "Improving Learning in the Middle Grades." The meeting will coincide with the annual Junior High School Conference. The workshop will be held at the Burlington Holiday Inn.

One highlight of the program will be a visit to Woodlawn Middle School in Mebane, a model educational program. One of the most crucial issues facing our public school systems is the matter of a relevant instructional program for youngsters in the middle grades, said State School Superintendent Craig Phillips. "This Conference - its theme and activities - recognized this fact and should be of interest to all educators working with late childhood or early adolescent students," he said.

The agenda is designed to assure direct participation of participants who will represent all sections of the State. A variety of activities are planned. Keynote speaker at the meeting will be Dr. Gerthon Morgan, professor of Education and Director of the Institute of Child Study at the University of Maryland. He will discuss the characteristics, needs, and implications of middle school programs at 6:30 p.m. Tuesday, March 16. Among those attending the conference will be Mr. William D. Tice Principal of Hertford Grammar School.

Also on the program will be Dr. James Moore, Director of Curriculum, West Hartford Public Schools; Dr. John Cameron, Director of Facilities Development, U.S. Office of Education; Charles Jones, Principal of Wilde Lake Middle School, Columbia, Maryland; and Dr. Harold Penstone, Principal of Barrington District Schools, Barrington, Illinois.

Conference coordinators are Samuel M. Holten, UNC-Chapel Hill, and Howard E. Rinhardt, State Department of Public Instruction.
