

## Eye Makeup

Women in most countries have in recent years turned to eye makeup as their latest beauty weapon. The trend began in cities and has spread to such an extent that even relatively young girls are now coated about the eyes with bright blue or green goo from early morning onward.

While such makeup pleases some, it is a good bet that most men prefer natural eyes, or almost natural. The cosmetic industry has thus reaped millions from the sale of this beauty aid when most men probably prefer girls who do not use it.

Now comes the advice of Dr. Louis Wilson, an eye surgeon of the Medical College of Georgia, who says many women and girls are infecting their eyes by the daily use of makeup compounds in which high concentrations of organisms grow.

Wilson based his remarks on a study of the eyes of 233 women, their makeup containers and the makeup itself. The organisms usually begin to grow in the makeup when the container is opened, he says, despite preservatives designed to prevent such growth.

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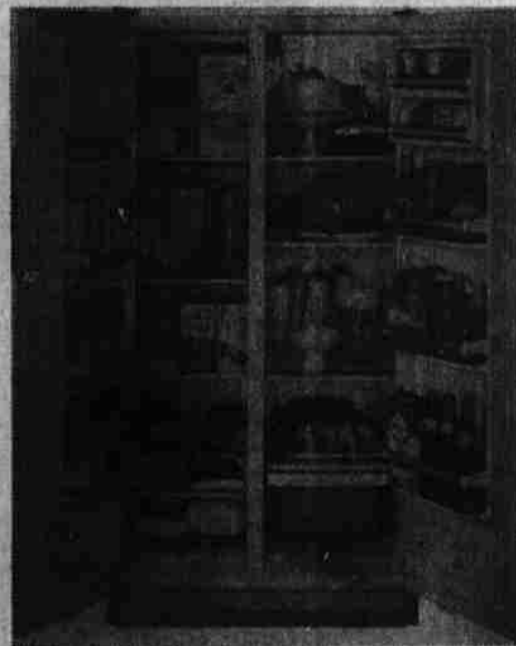
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
