In a large skillet lightly brown onions in the crisco. Add ground beef and continue stirring until beef turns dark and is separated. Add mushroom soup, corn, celery and green pepper. Stir often and add a little water if necessary. Cover and simmer until done. Cook noodles in salted boiling water. Add to beef mixture and season. Pour into casserole, cover with condensed tomato soup and cover lightly with grated cheese. Return to oven long enough for mixture to bubble.
