

Minutes Of Town Commissioners

The regular meeting of the Town Board of Commissioners was held on November meeting of the Town Board of Commissioners was held on November 8, 1971 at 7:30 p.m. with presiding Mayor W.D. Cox, Commissioners John G. Beers, Jesse L. Harris and Billy Winslow present. Commissioner C.C. Winslow was absent.

Mr. C.E. Winslow, Chairman, gave the ABC Store sales for October 1971. Sales were \$23,429.75, showing a decrease of \$1745.15 under sales for October 1970.

Chief B.L. Gibbs gave a report on Police Department activities. The Board appointed Graham Trent and Jesse L. Harris to serve a term of one year on the Board of Albemarle Regional Planning & Development Commission.

Motion went on record that all Privilege License are due January 1 of each year with a 2 per cent penalty starting July 1 and 1 per cent thereafter each month until paid.

The Board appointed Reverend J.H. London and Gene Phillips to serve a 2 year term on the Board of Adjustments of the Town of Hertford.

Mayor Cox reported on street repairs and newly paved streets in the Town.

Motion was made by the Board to give each Town employee a turkey for Christmas. Thomas Line Company was awarded the contract for electrical work to be done at the new site of Don Juan Manufacturing Company.

With no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was ordered adjourned.

Enrolled In UNC-G Honors Program

A student from Perquimans County is among the 76 students enrolled in the Honors Program at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro for the fall semester of the 1971-72 year. She is Mary Susan Harrell, a junior, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles M. Harrell Jr., Railroad St., Hertford, who is majoring in English at UNC-G. She is participating in the junior honors seminar.

Honors students take special courses in addition to work related to their degree requirements. The program is supervised by an Honors Council composed of 10 faculty members. Superior academic achievement is a prerequisite for admission to the program.

Sophomore honors students are able to choose either a tutorial, in which a small group of students explore a selected theme with a faculty member, or an interdisciplinary seminar which deals with a theme that cuts across departmental lines.

Juniors are offered a seminar dealing with the attempts of the human mind to understand itself and the human situation. Seniors are enrolled in a seminar which allows individual study under the guidance of a faculty member.

Forty-seven sophomores, 17 juniors and 12 seniors are involved in the honors program out of an undergraduate enrollment of 5,145. UNC-G also has over 1,800 graduate students. A selected number of freshmen students will be invited to participate in honors program tutorials during the spring semester.

The honors program provides one hour credit each semester for sophomores and three hours credit each semester for juniors and seniors.

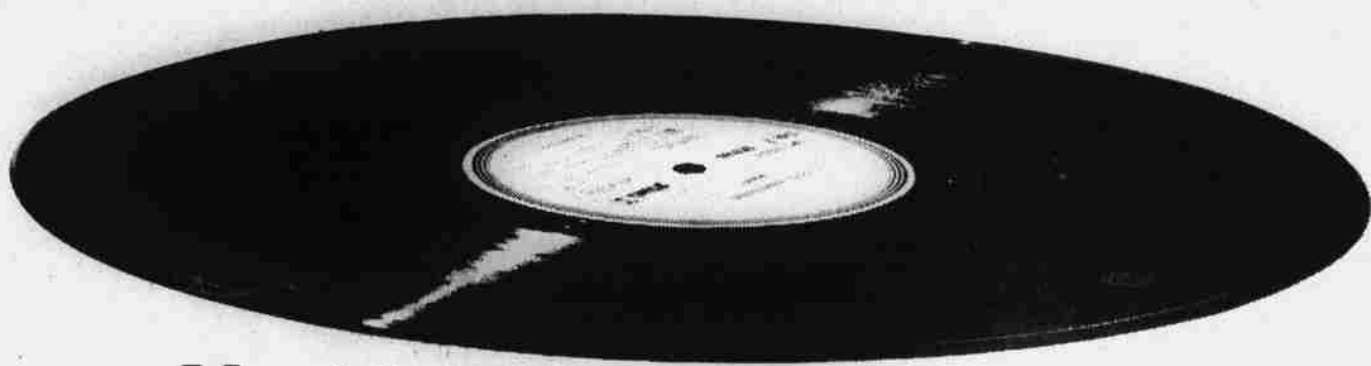
