**UNC-S.C. Nursing
Supervision In
Cardiac Unit**

The University of North Carolina School of Nursing will hold a two week short course on nursing supervision in the cardiac unit here March 13-24.

Co-sponsored by the School's Continuing Education Program and the North Carolina Heart Association, the course is designed to enable the professional nurses to expand basic knowledge and skills in coronary care and increase expertise in personal supervision in the unit.

A variety of learning experiences will be used including lectures, demonstrations, visual aids, group discussion and laboratory practice.

Faculty for the course will be Joan Ganong, nursing supervision consultant, vice president and nursing consultant, W. L. Ganong, Co., Pittsburg, Pa.; Ethel Harrison, assistant clinical professor, UNC School of Nursing and Intensive Care Supervisor, N. C. Memorial Hospital; and staff from the UNC Schools of Nursing, Medicine and Public Health and N. C. Memorial Hospital.

Applicants must have a position with responsibility of supervising or teaching personnel in giving nurse care in a cardiac unit and completed classes in the basic theoretical concepts and technical aspects in care of the patient with a coronary problem.

Soaring Taxes

A study of the Commerce Clearing House in Chicago shows state and local taxes soaring in many states and taxpayers being increasingly burdened by these increases. New York State leads the nation with an average state and local tax take of \$652 per citizen (not per family) and Arkansas, with a \$252 per capita average, is the lowest-taxing state.

What concerns many is the rate of increase in state and local taxes. In 1971 thirty of the fifty states raised their tax rates in some form. Most of the nation's larger cities also raised rates, as did many smaller cities. Thus most Americans were hit with both city and state tax increases, plus some federal tax increases.

The rate of increase in 1971 was highest in the following states: Alaska, Virginia, Kentucky, Maryland, Hawaii, District of Columbia, Illinois, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Nebraska, Missouri, North Carolina, Delaware, Maine, Georgia, Alabama, New Jersey, Iowa, South Carolina, Massachusetts, Vermont and Michigan, in that order. Yet the 1971 increase can mean comparatively little in a state such as South Carolina, where state and local taxes in 1971 claimed only \$274 per capita while states like Nevada and California, with lesser 1971 percentage increases, exacted a toll of over \$500 per capita.

As the tax take continues to increase, as do prices, it becomes almost mandatory that the federal government begin sharing some of its revenue with states, to enable them to hold state taxes at their present level, or in some cases to aid communities sufficiently so that excessive property taxes can be reduced.

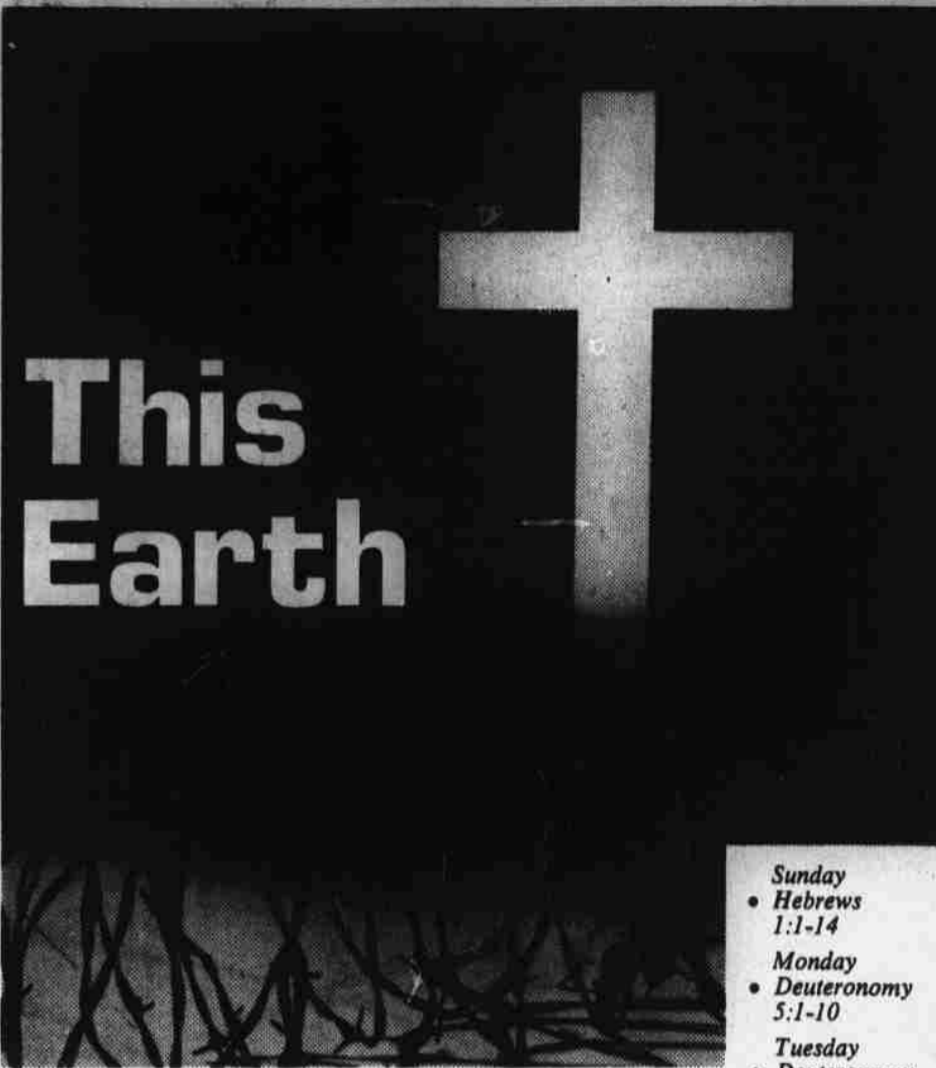
