Principal amount of said bonds authorized by this bond order shall be Twenty-six Thousand Dollars (\$26,000).  
Section 3. Said Board of Commissioners has also ascertained and hereby determines that the purpose hereinbefore described is a necessary expense of said County within the meaning of Section 2 of Article V of the Constitution of North Carolina and is a special purpose with the

special approval of the General Assembly for which said County may raise or appropriate money, and is not a current expense of said County.

Section 4. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.  
Section 5. A statement of the County debt of the County of Perquimans has been filed with the Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of said County and is open to public inspection.

Section 6. No debt shall be contracted during any fiscal year by the issuance of bonds

pursuant to this bond order if the amount of such debt and of all other debt contracted during such fiscal year shall exceed two-thirds of the amount by which the outstanding indebtedness of said County shall have been reduced during the next preceding fiscal year, unless the incurring of such debt shall be submitted to a vote of the people of said County and shall be approved by a majority of those who vote thereon.

Section 7. This bond order shall take effect thirty days after its first publication after final passage, unless, in the

meantime, a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under The County Finance Act, and in such event, it shall take effect when approved by the voters of said County at an election as provided in said Act.  
The foregoing Bond Order has been introduced and a sworn statement has been filed under The County Finance Act, showing the assessed valuation of the County to be \$25,081,169.00 and the net debt for other than school purposes, including the proposed bonds, to be \$26,000.00. A tax will be levied for the

payment of the proposed bonds, and interest, if the same shall be issued. Any citizen or taxpayer may protest against the issuance of such bonds at a meeting of the Board of Commissioners to be held at the regular meeting place of said Board in the Perquimans County Courthouse, in Hertford, North Carolina, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., on the 4th day of April, 1972, or an adjournment thereof.

their finding:

(a) Younger mothers who have two or more children rapidly are still making a marriage adjustment to their husbands. Their attention is torn between the children and concern for the marriage. Neither the children nor the husband gets all the needs met.

(b) The responsibilities of several children, a husband, and a household to run require more emotional maturity than most young wives can possess. Any young wife needs a few years to develop maturity in the relationship with her husband before the responsibility for children comes along.

A little thinking about this study would seem to indicate that family planning is needed. A young couple needs time to adjust to each other without the responsibilities that children bring. As energetic as young people are, too many responsibilities, too soon, can be too much!

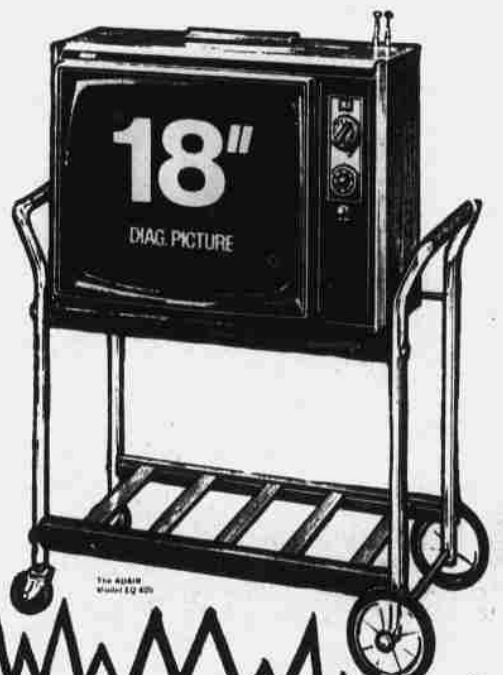
