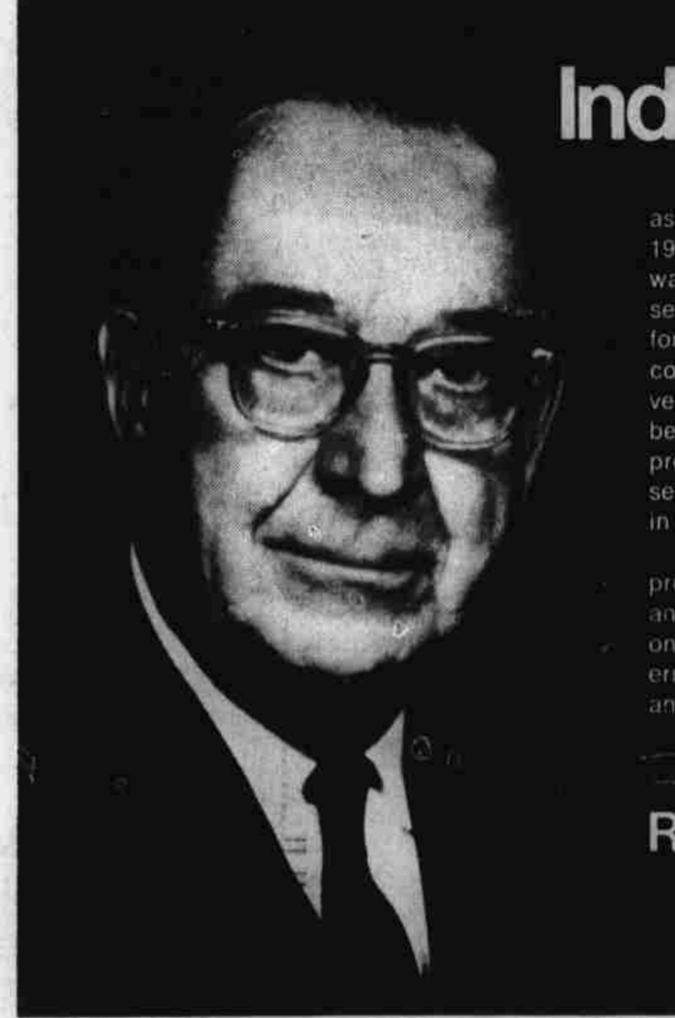

**Industry Counts**  
Senator Jordan has many times identified water as the principal key to industrial growth, and in 1966 he said that "We need to do today with water what we did with electric and telephone service in our state 30 years ago." He called for networks of county-wide and area-wide inter-connecting water systems, noting that future development would follow the water lines. The year before that he had helped enact the law which provides federal assistance for rural water and sewer systems such as the ones now operating in Anson and Davidson counties.

He sees good highways as another key to progress, including improved interstate highways, and as a ranking member of the Sub-committee on Roads he has pushed for provision of a modern and safe highway network in North Carolina and the nation.
