# Crossroads Of Aging

The place you call home is where you will be spending the greatest amount of time and if you are building a house, it will most likely be your largest single investment. With this in mind, it is important that thought and planning be given to designing your house for your comfort and convenience in later years.

I am especially aware of the need for this kind of planning, as I am in a wheelchair. I designed my present home to provide facilities for being capable of living independently. I will be glad to be of assistance to anyone desiring information. (Jacqueline Ricks, Box 587, Edenton, N.C. 27932 or telephone 482-8444.)

Some areas should be given special consideration. At least one outside entrance should be ground level or low enough to easily be ramped. Preferably the living area should be all on one floor with windows large and low enough to give a pleasant view while sitting.

Two important features are doors which should be at least 32 inches wide, preferably 36 inches, and halls a minimum of four feet wide. This will allow sufficient space if a wheelchair is needed. It will also enable in an emergency, rescue squad personnel to easily reach a patient with a stretcher. Rescue squads often encounter serious problems in homes because of inadequate space in which to function. An advantage will be

easy movement of furniture.

A vital area is the bathroom which should adjoin or be near the bedroom. Attention should be given to adequate space and placement of fixtures. The toilet seat should be at least 18 inches from the floor. Grab bars should be used for safety. A storage area should be available in the bathroom for supplies.

Another important room is the kitchen with emphasis placed on convenience of arrangement to meet individual needs. Counters, cabinets, stoves and ovens should be at appropriate heights with an area to work in a sitting position. The dining area should be near the cooking area.

Lighting should be adequate with ample outlets and switches and convenient heights. More light for good vision is needed as you grow older. Additional lighting is needed in cooking and other work areas.

In planning don't forget your own personality creating a cheerful atmosphere.
