Veterans Administration

Newly appointed directors and assistant directors of Veterans Administration hospitals and regional offices will soon have the opportunity to participate in a series of management skills seminars under a new program announced today by H.W. Johnson, Director of the Winston-Salem VA Regional Office.

The seminars, which will be scheduled in the near future, are the first step in launching a new VA Executive Training Center. They will be followed with more comprehensive training for other selected groups of VA executives.

Johnson pointed out that the need to serve Vietnam veterans will place rapidly changing new demands on programs in the 1970's. This makes it imperative that managerial skills of key personnel be developed to the maximum extent.

The VA operates a vast nationwide network of over 200 major installations and employs 184,000.

Commenting on the planned Training Center, Johnson noted that VA is firmly committed to the establishment of meaningful executive development plans for the continuing development of incumbent career executives as well as programs for mid-managers of highest potential.

Johnson said that the seminars for top field managers would be geared to the down to earth management problems faced by administrators every day and would include such subjects as budget formulation, public and community relations, labor management relations, equal employment opportunity, organizational development techniques and expertise of its own personnel as well as other government officials and members from the academic community.

Johnson commented that these programs are in line with the President's policies regarding development of Federal executives, and would provide additional opportunities for minority employees and women to improve their skills
