N.C. Farm Bureau Convention Set For Nov. 19-22

The 37th annual convention of the North Carolina Farm Bureau Federation has been set for November 19-22 at the Durham Hotel and Motel in Durham.

Primary attention will be focused on the drafting of official state Farm Bureau policies by voting delegates to the state convention.

Included among convention speakers will be Allan Grant, president of the California Farm Bureau, who also serves as vice-president of the American Farm Bureau, and Dr. John T. Caldwell, chancellor of N.C. State University at Raleigh. Other speakers will be announced at a later date.

B. C. Mangum, president of the North Carolina Farm Bureau, the state's largest general farm organization, expressed the belief that this would be the best attended convention ever.

William P. Rogers, Secretary of State: "Let it (General Assembly) prove the United Nations is capable of the concrete action necessary to bring us closer to a world free of violence."

Richard Nixon, President: "The United States will be in the forefront of efforts to achieve a reform of the international monetary system."
