Landscape Fashions Change

Make Plans Before Planting Trees

Tree planting around a home is a long-term "investment" that can add greatly to the beauty and comfort of a home -provided that the selection and location of the trees are well thought

Years ago, it was the landscape fashion to have two large "twin" trees on either side of the front walk, flanking the entranceway. But things have changed. Today, the trend is toward a natural grouping that will eventually give the appearance that the trees were planted by nature.

North Carolina State University horticulturists suggest that, in most cases, two trees are needed to frame a house. This is true if the property is large and the house is set far back from the street or highway, as is often found at the farm home.

The smaller the



house, the smaller the trees you should plant, the NCSU specialists suggest. Consider using one large tree on one side and a cluster of small-growing trees on the opposite side. This gives a natural unbalanced appearance. especially desirable for homes of informal architecture. However.
