Christmas Pageant

Judge Wilton Walker presided at the Wednesday session of Perquimans County District Court and found Ruby Jones guilty of failure to send minor children to school. The defendant received a 6 months sentence suspended for 5 years with the following conditions — 1. defendant shall send all minor children of school age to school on a regular basis and see that they come properly clothed and clean on each school day; 2. she must see that children retire early; 3. in addition, she must keep said children off the streets after 8 p.m. unless accompanied by her, or unless they have the approval of the Police Department of Hertford. The defendant was, also, taxed with the costs of court.

Roy Stanley Pierce, charged with non-support of children, was given a 6 months suspended for 5 years with the conditions — 1. must pay \$30.00 per week beginning immediately and to be paid each week no later than Friday; 2. pay cost of Capias; 3. shall with reasonable frequency (at least once each month) report his current earnings employment — status and shall inform Clerk of Superior Court of his address.

Cause retained for further orders. Case on support of wife was continued; Albert Eugene Moore, charged with driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor, was given a 90 day sentence suspended for 12 months on the condition that he pay a fine of \$125.00 and costs, and not operate a motor vehicle in the State of North Carolina for a period of 12 months. An appeal was noted and the case was placed on the Superior Court Docket. Bond was set at \$500.00; Nell Lawrence Bowen was taxed with a fine of \$10.00 and costs on a speeding charge.

UNC-G is one of only five colleges and universities in North Carolina which has a Phi Beta Kappa chapter. The other schools are Davidson, Duke University, UNC-CH and Wake Forest University.
