A special course, "Uniform Local Government Accounting", is now being taught at the College of the Albemarle. These classes were designed by the Institute of Government in Chapel Hill to teach city and county managers, finance officers, and accounting clerical personnel about a new system of accounting.

According to the North Carolina Local Government Commission, this new accounting system recognizes the "limited resources available to cities and counties with a population under 25,000." It also has an improved financial reporting structure so that officials, governing bodies, and taxpayers can understand the financial situation of a city or county more readily.

This course conducted through the COA Continuing Education Department is taught by COA instructor P.L. Winslow. Classes began in January and will end in April. Those currently enrolled are:
