Sheltered Workshop Sought For Ten-County Area

EDENTON — The Albemarle Human Resources Development System will make a grant request to the North Carolina Department of Mental Health for establishing a sheltered workshop to serve the ten-county area. James E. Lewis, Executive Director of AHRDS, said the application for \$51,000 will be submitted by April 1st. He praised the efforts of a group of area citizens, who have been working for nearly a year to establish a facility for the handicapped.

"The need for a workshop has been determined," Lewis said. "AHRDS is working to develop a total program for all citizens of the Albemarle and the handicapped person's needs have been overlooked too long." The facility would serve adults eighteen and over who are physically, mentally and socially handicapped. The blind would also be included, Lewis said.

The goal will be to facilitate the development of the total individual to become self-supportive and to gain a sense of personal value and worth.

Former Director Honored By Cancer Group

Dr. Isa C. Grant, former health department physician at the district health department was honored recently at the American Cancer Society mid-winter conference.

Since 1954, Dr. Grant has served in the Wake County and the Pasquotank-Perquimans-Camden-Chowan district as health director. For the past four and a half years she has served as chief of the chronic disease section of the North Carolina State Board of Health.

She has served on many boards and health and civic committees and commissions. She works closely with the governor's Commission on cancer, the North Carolina Medical Society, and other organizations.

A. Grant Whitney, president of the American Cancer Society, presented the award. Mrs. H.C. Sullivan is president of the Perquimans County Chapter of the American Cancer Society.

Students Can Yell: 'Quiet, Let's Roll'

CHAPEL HILL — With a movie camera, a few rolls of film and art idea, North Carolina public school students can make and exhibit their own films in the Tar Heel Student Film Festival '73 scheduled for April 21 in Chapel Hill. The festival is the first in the state for students in grades one through twelve. The deadline for submitting films is April 16.

Not a competition, the film festival is an exhibition of movies made by Tar Heel student filmmakers. By submitting films, students will have an opportunity to show their work to an audience of students and teachers across the state.

There is no entry fee for participating in the festival, according to Calvin Pryluck of the UNC Department of Radio, Television and Motion Pictures. Pryluck, director of the festival, teaches a film course, "Elementary Motion Picture Production for Teachers," in addition to his regular teaching responsibilities in the RTVMP Department.

A number of the films will be shown on the television program "North Carolina: The Arts" on Sunday, May 13. "The Arts" is broadcast on University Television's statewide network of eight stations.
