The 28th Annual Albemarle Livestock Show and Sale was held Wednesday, May 2, at the Jaycee Fair Grounds in Elizabeth City.

There was a total of 15 steers and 48 hogs exhibited in the show.

Perquimans County 4-H'ers captured top honors in both steer and hog divisions. The Grand Champion steer was shown by Edward Winslow, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clifford Winslow of Belvidere.

The choice Hertford steer weighed 949 lbs. and was purchased by R.O. Givens of Elizabeth City for \$96 per lb. Grand champion hog was shown by Kent Copeland, son of Mr. and Mrs. Parker Copeland of Rt. 2, Hertford.

The hog weighing 185 lbs was purchased by Moody Harrell and Sons for \$1,32 1/2 per lb.

In addition to the Grand Champion two other steers were shown from Perquimans County. Stan Winslow, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clifford Winslow showed a choice steer purchased by Central Fertilizer Company of Shawboro, N.C. for \$66 per lb.

Arden Stallings of Belvidere exhibited a choice steer, purchased by Shawboro Tractor for \$74 1/2 per lb.

George W. Marshall will have with him Mr. Sandy McKeel who is in charge of the 502 programs in the SBA District Office at Charlotte, North Carolina. George Wheeler Marshall was appointed District Director of the U.S. Small Business Administration in the Charlotte District Office on April 26, 1970.

Prior to assuming the highest position in the State of North Carolina for the Agency, Marshall was an Area Representative with the Savings Bond Division of the U.S. Treasury in Greensboro for one year.

In 1961 he established and operated his own business, Master Printers Company, which dealt in design of office procedures for business systems, including layout, printing and installation of systems.

He was amply trained for entering such a business by his previous experience with Ditto, Inc., which firm he joined in 1948. He continued with that company until 1961, serving in various capacities in many cities, culminating in his transfer to Greensboro.

Marshall completed high school in Townville, Penna. and was graduated from Chicago Technical College in 1951, majoring in electrical engineering.

He fulfilled his military obligation to his country when he served in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1945, receiving a Presidential Unit Citation. His career with Ditto, Inc. was interrupted by his recall to active duty in the Navy during the Korean Conflict from 1951 to 1952.

He has been active in Republican politics since 1960, serving as a candidate for the State Legislature and finally being named Alternate to the Republican National Convention in 1968 by six Congressional District Conventions.

Born in Chicago, Ill. September 22, 1925, he is married to the former Marion Louise Mattmuller and has 1 son, Gary, 23 years, and 2 daughters, Carol, 21 years and Marie 15 years.
