

Swindell-Barnard Married Saturday

In a ceremony characterized by dignity and simplicity, Miss Sheron Lynn Swindell became the bride of Ronnie Martin Barnard Saturday at 3 p.m. in the First United Methodist Church, Hertford.

The vows were spoken in a setting of candlelight and altar baskets of white gladioli, baby's breath, stock and pink daisies. The Rev. Milton T. Mann officiated at the double ring ceremony.
