
The North Carolina tour is one of twenty-eight led by the Bishops of United Methodism to the scenes where their denomination had its beginnings.

Daniel Webster said, "My heart has always assured and reassured me that the gospel of Christ must be a Divine reality. This belief enters into the very depth of my conscience. The whole history of man proves it." Such a note of assurance is sounded by the Apostle

Paul in our lesson today. Such assurance is essential for all who would be bearers of the "Good news" to the

Worth, Romans 1:16-17 Paul had been imprisoned in Philippi because of the Gospel. He had been chased out of the city of Thessalonica, smuggled out of Berea, and ignored in Athens because of the Gospel. Yet he says he is proud of the Gospel of Christ. Paul sees the good news (gospel) as the power of God unto salvation to all who will believe.

Man's greatest need in every age is salvation from the penalty and power of sin. The Bible pictures man as being lost (Matthew 18:11; Luke 19:10). Man is not on the right road unless he has experienced the spiritual birth (John 3:3,5).

Man is enslaved by sin and needs to be saved from

sin (Matthew 1:21). Paul knew from his own personal experience that the Gospel of Christ is God's power for salvation. Someone has said, 'Because God is God, because God is characteristically holy, God cannot tolerate sin, and the wrath of God is God's annihilating reaction against sin."

There is ample warning through the Bible to man to flee the wrath of God. This wrath is directed against men who hinder the truth by

suppressing it. Men who choose to ignore God and give God up will be given up by God!

Man is without excuse. All of the visible things of creation teach us that there are invisible things of God. Luther said, "God writes the gospel not in the Bible alone, but on trees, and flowers, and clouds, and stars,"


